

out 'n about 'n loving life.....


Over the Christmas holidays, our children did lots of swimming; this is a favourite pastime for them with Pilot Bay at the Mount being a preferred location to chill and swim.

2022 THE YEAR OF NEW BEGINNINGS

the year is ahead of us and we can't wait!

The children are back at school with one child having been selected for the Athletic Development Programme at his school which he is very proud of.

Ripper Rugby is just around the corner, one or two are preparing for the rugby season and others are well into Number Words and Works which has been worth its weight in gold to bring many of our children up to speed with their peers. We also have mentors for some of our children who we feel can benefit with one-on-one time.

We are continuing our journey in bi-cultural practice. We have several members of our team who are confident and competent regarding Te Ao Māori and their guidance and support in this area has been helpful in supporting the growth and development of other members of our team.

Our Practice Manager continues to work alongside Oranga Tamariki to ensure our tamariki have the right information related to their identity and our house parents continue to support each of them to grow in confidence in the space of Te Ao Māori, while also ensuring they stay connected to their whānau

This provides a layer of accountability to ensure that investigation into wider whānau, hāpu and iwi options for tamariki Māori occurs as traditionally this has not been the case. This also protects tamariki Māori from being disconnected from their sense of identity and belonging, which are known factors to Māori being over represented in our nation's worst statistics.



Currently, we provide away from home care for tamariki, particularly sibling groups, within a community setting. The recent changes to the way Oranga Tamariki practices in line with 7aa Quality Assurance Standards (recently new legislative requirements) give us the opportunity to better meet the needs of our community.

To actively engage and meet this opportunity, we are restructuring our offices and children's homes to be able to include a pilot for a new way of working with both tamariki and their whānau into the future. This will provide an opportunity for more children to stay within their whānau, rather than be placed in care.

To ensure that Homes of Hope can continue to provide outstanding services, we need to ensure that we are meeting the current need of both tamariki, their whānau, Oranga Tamariki and the Treaty of Waitangi principles.

This way of working is encouraging Homes of Hope to step up and deliver even greater outcomes for tamariki and their whānau over the coming years. We will be able to update you more with this pilot in the coming months.

We know through experience that tamariki generally never want to leave their homes. Sometimes this is not possible to ensure their safety. At Homes of Hope, we are committed to finding new ways to work towards better outcomes for both tamariki and their whānau.

We have 5 therapists serving the needs of children now, two fully qualified and three interning.




It has been difficult managing consistent sessions as we journey through the Covid restrictions, illnesses and isolations, and we very much look forward to a time when we are beyond this pandemic.



The power of the process for tamariki journeying through the play therapy process is one which brings deep internal resolution, coming to terms with, their trauma, be it grief and loss, vicarious violence, violence, abuse or neglect. The person-hood of the child is helped to heal, not by didactic means, but by supporting the child's own resourcefulness within a deeply trusting relationship.



We **are so extremely grateful to have the support of the Hugh Green Foundation** which enables us to provide this beautiful therapeutic modality for children and their families. The needs are great, and there are so many who cannot afford to access this support.

creators, planners and problem solvers in so many ways!


Veleska who works with Beca contacted us right out of the blue to let us know they wanted to make us one of their three charities of choice for Christmas.

and thanks to Mike and the team for your support


